# <u>President's Letter,</u> <u>Summer 2020</u>

Fellow WALL Members,

This has been a challenging yet interesting year. The Corona virus forced a suspension of several classes this Spring, but introduced us to the use of ZOOM as a way to complete two courses. It

also paved the way for the first Summer WALL program which initially provided four courses and later included an International series of conversations with individuals in Germany, Italy, China, St. Vincent Medical School in the Caribbean, Chile and Sweden.

Wesleyan College plans to open with social distancing, which provides for requiring space between attendees to avoid transmission of the virus. WALL will also practice social distancing in the 11 courses planned for the fall. Those courses will be presented live, and we are working with Wesleyan on a method to simultaneously present the courses on ZOOM. Masks will be required for all members attending live classes and social distancing will be observed.

Online registration will open on Monday, July 13<sup>th</sup>. For members wishing to register using a printed form, WALL officers will be at the Wesleyan Market on Saturday, July 11<sup>th</sup> from 9AM to 1 PM.

I hope everyone is well and looking forward to this coming semester, whether you participate by attending class or joining us on ZOOM.
